"Living in Service to the Inexplicable and Paradoxical"

"The spirit of the depths took my understanding and all my knowledge and placed them at the service of the inexplicable and the paradoxical."

C.G. Jung (The Red Book p. 229)

Wherever we look opposites abound often accompanied by fears of every increasing polarization and disintegration. Jung's view of psyche is rooted in an appreciation for polar opposites and the important roles they play in our life. By creatively working with opposites, we actually reduce the risks of destructive polarizations. Indeed, embracing life's 'inexplicable and paradoxical' nature leads to wholeness and a soulful connection to the world. In this presentation I explore Jung's explorations of the paradoxical nature of opposites and how the inexplicable can connect us to a deeply meaningful universe. To this end, I consider various fields of 'extraordinary knowing' that influenced Jung's view of psyche, in particular the role of synchronicity plays in creatively complementing our purely rational worldview.
